## TRAVEL AND TOURISM WORKS FOR ARKANSAS

- Domestic and international travelers to Arkansas spent \$6.3 billion in 2013 and generated \$868.8 million to federal, state and local governments, dollars that help fund jobs and public programs such as police, firefighters, teachers, road projects and convention centers.
- The 61,152 jobs created by travelers to Arkansas in 2013 represent 6.5% of the state's total non-farm employment.
- Without these jobs generated by domestic and international travel, Arkansas's 2013 unemployment rate of 7.5% would have been 12.2% of the labor force.
- For every \$1 million spent in Arkansas by domestic and international travelers 9.7 jobs are created.

## TRAVEL AND TOURISM IS CRITICAL TO THE U.S. ECONOMY

Travel and Tourism is One of America's Largest Industries	• Generated more than <b>\$2.1 trillion</b> in <b>economic output</b> , with \$927.9 billion spent directly by domestic and international travelers that spurred an additional \$1.2 trillion in other industries.	
	• Directly generated <b>\$141.5 billion</b> in <b>tax revenue</b> for local, state and federal governments.	
	• Each U.S. household would pay <b>\$1,147 more in taxes</b> without the tax revenue generated by the travel and tourism industry.	
	• Direct spending by resident and international travelers in the U.S. averaged \$2.5 billion a day, \$105.8 million an hour, \$1.8 million a minute and \$29,398 a second.	
Travel and Tourism is America's Largest Services Export Industry	• <b>\$220.6 billion</b> in total travel and tourism-related exports (including travel spending, medical/education/border, seasonal, and other short-term workers spending, and international passenger fares receipts).	
	• <b>\$146.6 billion</b> in total travel and tourism-related imports (including U.S. residents' spending, medical/education/border, seasonal, and other short-term workers spending abroad, and international passenger fares paid to foreign carriers).	
	• Created <b>\$74 billion</b> in <b>balance of travel trade surplus</b> for the U.S.	
Travel and Tourism is One of America's Largest Employers	• Supported <b>15.0 million jobs</b> , including 8.0 million directly in the travel industry and 7.0 million in other industries.	
	• <b>\$221.7 billion</b> in travel-generated <b>payroll</b> for those employed directly in U.S. travel industry.	
	• One in every nine U.S. non-farm jobs is created directly or indirectly or is induced by travel and tourism.	
	• Travel is among the <b>top 10 industries</b> in 49 states and D.C. in terms of employment.
